Visit to Exbury Gardens & Steam Railway.

There are only 25 seats left on the coach for this trip, so hurry! Don't miss out.

Exbury Gardens is a 200-acre informal woodland site in Hampshire, featuring rhododendrons, camellias and azaleas, which should be at their very best when we visit. Members will be able to stroll through the hydrangea walk, the rock garden, the Iris Garden, the Sundial and Centenary gardens and note the beauty of the Camellia walk.

An added bonus is a trip on the steam railway around the dragonfly pond, the Summer Lane garden, past the rock gardens and into the American garden.

The Little Kitchen company manages refreshments at Exbury for coffees, teas etc., or for brunch, lunch and afternoon tea. Members may wish to treat themselves or take a picnic instead. Sensible walking shoes are essential.

The cost of this outing, including return coach travel, garden entry, railway ride and a driver gratuity is £30 per person.

The coach will leave from outside Earley St. Peter's Church Hall car park at 9:30. We would expect to be back at home from Exbury by 5:30 pm.

Any help with manning the shed or unloading deliveries will be gratefully received.

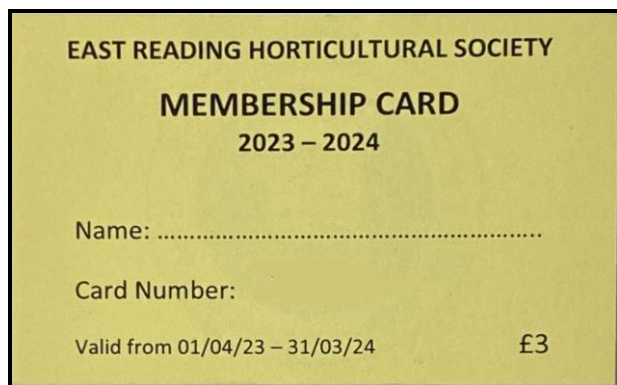

Membership Renewals

For members of ERHS who normally renew at the trading shed: stocks of the new 2023/24 membership card are now available at the shed.

You may renew now if you wish: you will need to show your 2022/23 membership card to the shed steward and will need to pay in cash. [For legal reasons, credit or debit card payments cannot be accepted for membership fees at present.]

The renewal fee remains at £3, and your new card will be valid from **01 April to 31 March 2024**. You will also need to collect a copy of the **ERHS Programme Sheet** next month (April), as the details will not be finalised until after the AGM.

For all other members: please wait until your Distributor / collector calls to collect your renewal fee and issue you with your new card and Programme Sheet. Please have your money available, and remember that the distributor may not carry much (or any) change. If you are not available when he/she calls, they will leave a note asking you to renew at the trading shed.

Things to do this month.



Sow outdoors

Broad beans, Beetroot (early varieties), Early carrots, Parsnips, Maincrop peas, Radish, Spinach, Spinach beet, Turnip.

Plant outdoors

Asparagus, Onion sets, Potatoes, Shallots, Jerusalem artichoke.

Sow indoors or in greenhouse, in trays and modules

Baby beetroot (M), Brussels sprouts, Kohlrabi (M), Early cabbage, Summer cabbage, Early cauliflower, Bulb onions, Spring onions, Tomatoes - for growing in a cold greenhouse or tunnel, Lettuce.

Note (M) these plants resent root disturbance and are best raised in module trays only.
